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About Survey

- The graduate survey is conducted annually in May-June to assess graduates' satisfaction with the educational process.
- In 2024, 735 respondents participated in the survey.
- The questionnaire includes questions on satisfaction with the educational process, departmental performance, and the psychological climate. The survey included questions rated on a 5-point scale, where 1 represents "completely dissatisfied" or "completely disagree" and 5 represents "completely satisfied" or "completely agree".

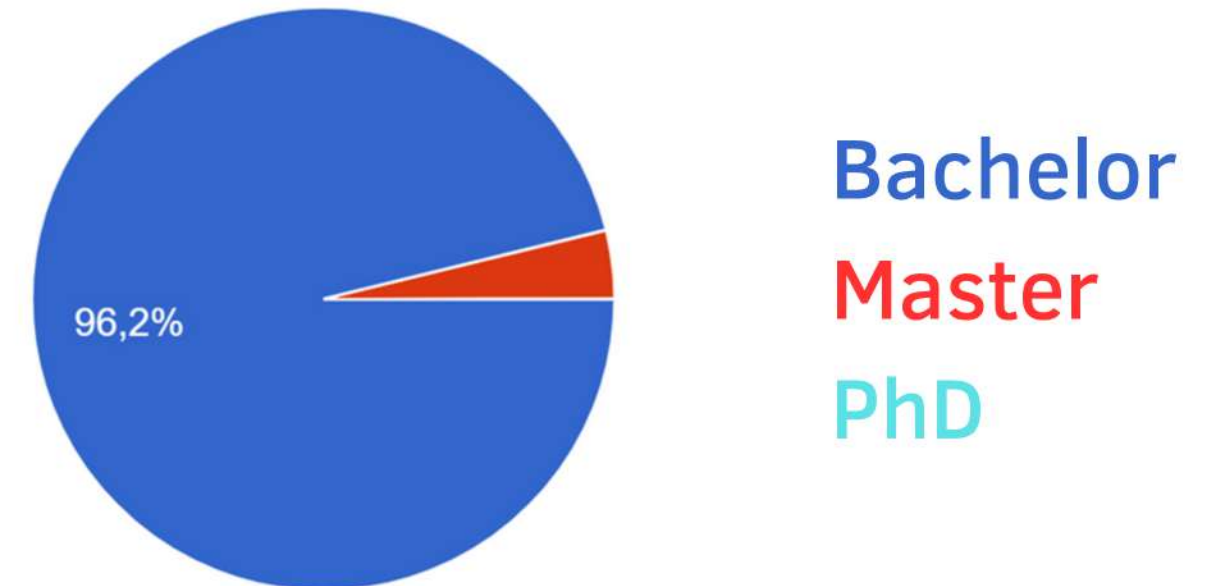


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Distribution of responses by Departments



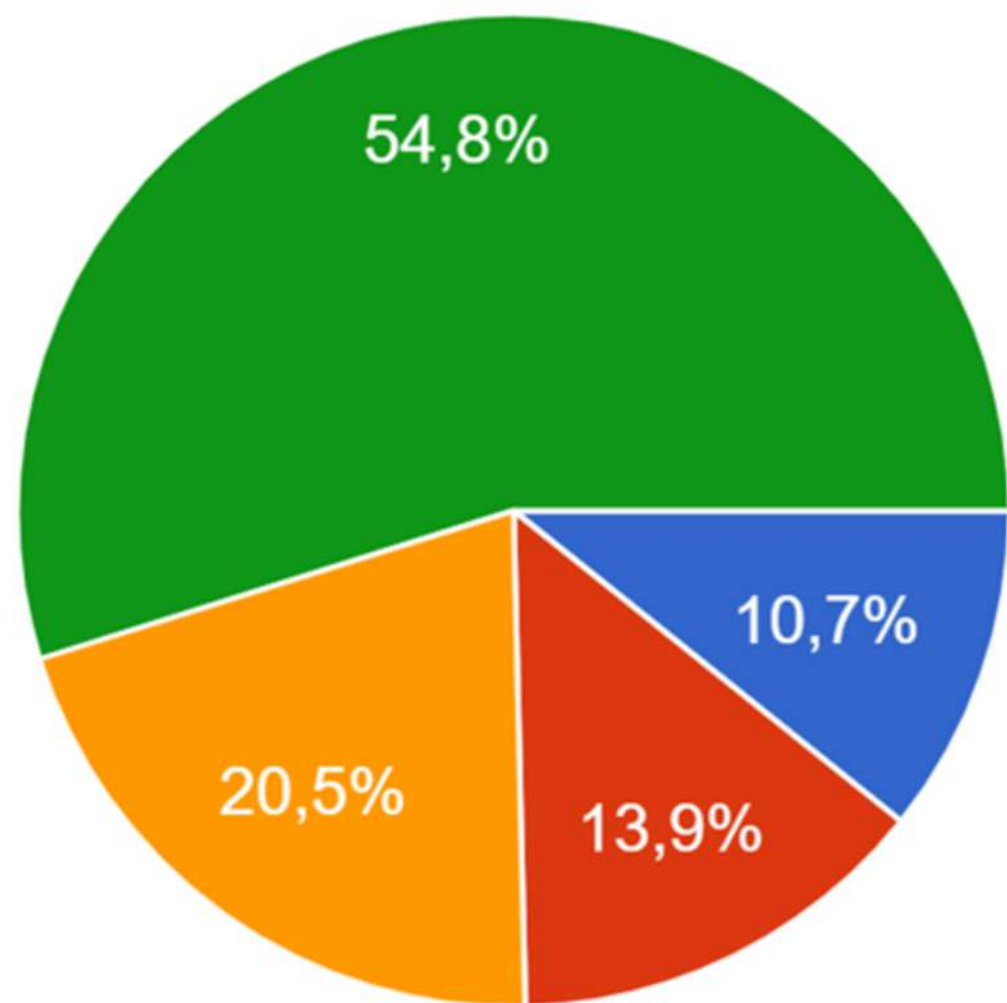
Distribution by Education Level
